VERONA POLICE DEPARTMENT MAJOR DISCIPLINE PUBLIC REPORT 2023

In accordance with the State of New Jersey Attorney General Guideline, *Internal Affairs Policy & Procedures*, as well as the State of New Jersey Attorney General Directives **2021-6**, *Directive Regarding Public Disclosure of the Identities of Officers Who Commit Serious Disciplinary Violations*, and **2022-14** *Transparency in Internal Affairs Investigations*, the Verona Police Department is required to identify all officers who have received major discipline, defined as termination, demotion, reduction in rank, or suspension of more than 5 days and also includes any sustained finding of the following; discrimination or bias against any person, excessive force, being untruthful or demonstrating a lack of candor, filed a false report, intentionally conducted an improper search, seizure or arrest, intentionally mishandled or destroyed evidence, engaged in an act of Domestic Violence, resigned, retired, transferred or separated from the agency while any internal affairs investigation or complaint was pending or was charged with an indictable crime, regardless of type or severity of discipline imposed.

This reporting period, set by the Attorney General, covers January 1, 2023 through December 31, 2023.

The Verona Police Department has had ZERO cases where an officer received major discipline, during the period of time outlined above.
